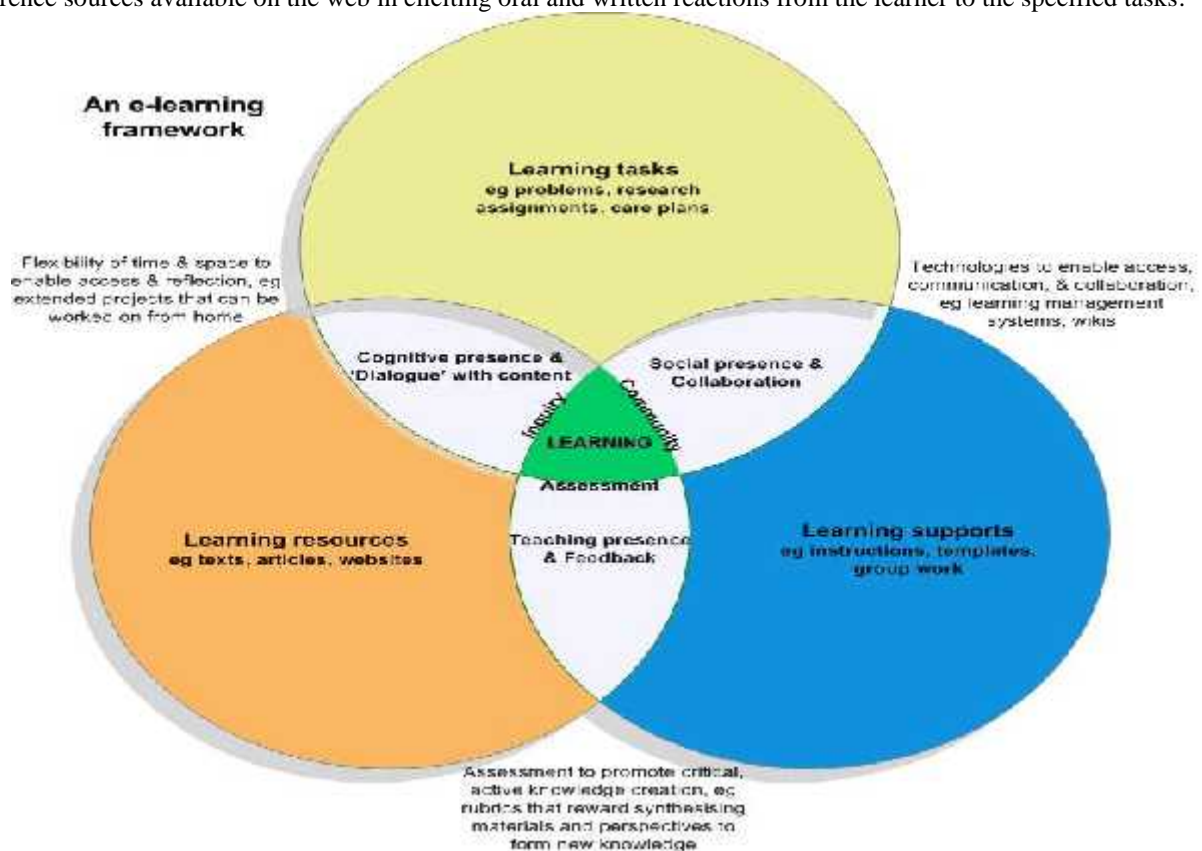
technology, language learning becomes a very effective way to enhance the basic communication proficiency of a learner. So the need of the hour is now integrating pedagogy and technology in teaching of English.

Emerging technologies make it practical to approach learning in ways that have been advocated by scientists, theorists, and educational psychologists for years. Advanced information technologies such as virtual reality, visualization, digital modeling, digitization, simulation, games, virtual worlds and intelligent one-on-one tutoring systems dramatically enhance teaching and learning of elusive concepts by translating abstractions into real-world contexts and providing customized instruction and individualized assessments. To realize the full potential of this technology and to ensure its pervasiveness in all institutions of learning and training, we must undertake a long-term, large-scale effort to research, develop, test and disseminate tools for building advanced learning systems.

Grammar Teaching

Using a free online grammar checker can be useful in certain circumstances. For example, students who are learning English as a second language may find that free online grammar checkers help them learn to more easily spot errors in their writing.

The following are some resources of free online grammar checkers:

* Spellchecker.net lets you copy and paste text into an online tool to quickly identify spelling and grammar errors. An online thesaurus is also available for your convenience.

* AbiWord is a free open source word processing program that includes a grammar checker. It is supported on all of the most common operating systems, including Linux, Mac OS X (PowerPC), and Microsoft Windows. The interface is similar to Microsoft Word, making this program very easy to use. Import and export filters let you convert documents to HTML, Rich Text Format, and OpenDocument for greater convenience.

* Language Tool is a free open source grammar checker that is designed to help users identify the most common grammatical mistakes in their text. Language Tool works to detect errors in English, German, Dutch, and Polish, but limited support is also available for French, Spanish and Italian. However, it is important to realize that Language Tool does not contain a spell checking program.

* Grammar Slammer is a spelling and grammar checker that uses a taskbar and integrated search to help identify errors in a document and suggest corrected text. You can download a free 21 day trial of this program or purchase the full version of the software for \$49.

Computer Adaptive Testing

The computer assisted /adaptive testing refers practices requiring a computer to assist in construction, analysis and reporting. CAT has received very positive reviews from testing specialists and the test makers as well. The benefits associated with this



method of assessing language skills, knowledge or performance are well documented in the publications of the proponents of this technology. Through CAT, one can present problems, test the students' knowledge and understanding, make judgment on students responses keep the record of that performance and measure in the student language gain and maintenance in a systematic manner it can allow the examinees to go through the process in their own face and thereby allowing the slow learners to attend the test taking process confidently. It provides creator accuracy and clarity in scoring and reliability in testing. Online testing is also being adopted in our country.

Bocji and Greasley (1999) conducted a long term study on computer based assessments with under graduate students and their findings are summarized as follows:

- Students find computer based tests less threatening than the conventional examinations.
- Students regard computer based testing to be more impartial than accurate conventional tests.
- Formative computer based assessments may help to improve the long term recall of key concepts.
